



MICROFIBER CLEANING AND USE INSTRUCTIONS

- **MaxiPlus® microfiber looped-end mops, flat mops and cloths are quality cleaning tools manufactured with a blend of 80% polyester and 20% polyamide (nylon) fibers.**
- **These fibers are 100 times finer than human hair. The dense construction creates a split microfiber that is positively charged and attracts negatively charged dust/dirt particles.**
- **Testing has shown microfiber products to clean more thoroughly while using significantly less chemicals. Using too strong a delusion of any chemical or cleaner can cause streaking to floors.**
- **MaxiPlus® microfiber flat mops can be laundered up to 500 times if proper laundering is used. These mops can withstand up to 200 degree water for bleach-free laundering. Less detergent can be used in the washing cycle, due to the nature and make-up of the fibers used in these products. There is no sponge used between the microfiber pad and the backing. A double layer of microfiber cloth, which will not build up bacteria, mold or dirt is used between the microfiber pad and backing to give the flat mops more stability.**
- **Laundering temperatures can be moderated with excellent results in cleaning the microfiber products. A short time in the drying cycle at moderate temperatures will insure a longer life of the products. Excessive heat will eventually break down the backing on the flat mops, leaving the products useless. NEVER use any fabric softener in the laundering cycle, as this will clog the pores of the microfiber and render it useless for cleaning. This will also cause extreme streaking on floors.**
- **When charging the flat mops, 18 pads can be placed in the charging buckets. Make sure the chemical delusion or delusion of neutral cleaner is exact and not too strong. After adding chemicals to the bucket, snap on the lid and turn the charging bucket over to allow chemical to flow through and soak pads. When a pad is attached to the frame make sure you tap the pad on the strainer to remove excess liquid from the pad. Pads should always be changed after the cleaning of each room and placed in a laundry bag or container for used mops/cloths to avoid cross-contamination.**
